

**Course Title:** The 10 Promised Paradise (Al Asharah tul Mubasharah)

**Course Faculty:** Faculty of Islamic History Studies

**Course Description:**

"And the first to embrace Islam of the Muhajirin and the Ansar and those who followed them exactly [in faith]. Allah is well pleased with them as they are well pleased with Him", {Surah At Taubah: 100}

The first generation of Muslims were no doubt the greatest Muslims in terms of their faith, their sacrifice and their honor of having met the greatest of creation, the Messenger of Allah صلى الله عليه وسلم. And yet, most Muslims today know less about them than they do about the celebrities they see around them in the media. How can we possibly aspire to follow in their footsteps and reach their ranks when we spend more time learning about the lives of celebrities than the lives of these great men, whom Allah Himself is pleased with.

This course is aimed at those who wish derive benefits from the lives of those who were closest to the Messenger صلى الله عليه وسلم in his times of need and in making Islam victorious, without whom, undoubtedly Islam would not have reached us.

**Course Overview:**

In this course you will learn the following topics about the two Imams:

- How were they related to the Messenger صلى الله عليه وسلم?
- Who were his closest male Companions?
- Which of them were the most virtuous and why?
- Why were they specifically named in this particular Hadith?
- What effect did they have on his life and Da'wah?
- Why are Khulafaa held in such high regard?
- What revelations were revealed concerning them?
- How did they defend the Messenger صلى الله عليه وسلم?
- How did he deal with companions in his life?
- What examples have they left for the believing men of today?
- What lessons can we derive from their lives?
- What is the ruling of one who insults any of the Companions?

**Course Duration:**

This course is taught over a 3 month period. Each week's lesson consists of 3 hours class time.

**Course Materials:**

This course will be based on various works of history and Fiqh. You should bring a notepad and pen to take notes.

### Homework:

For 3 hours of class work you will need to do at least 1 hour of homework, rewriting notes and revision each week.

### Examinations:

The final examination for what you will have learnt throughout this course, takes place on week 11, this consists of a 90 Minute written paper. The pass mark for this course is 50%.
